Anchorage approach	The outer anchorage is very poor and the port authorities do not recommend anchoring other than at St Helena Bay, with SAMSA permission, which is situated approx 4 hours steaming NNE of Saldanha Bay (St. Helena Bay). It provides good holding, but is exposed to N gales, heavy seas and swells in the winter. There is safe anchorage at the inner anchorage where a limited number of vessels can be accommodated at a time.
Min. depth at anchorage/Channel	The depth of the navigation channel is 23.7m CD, width 400m, the turning basin situated seaward of the jetty has a diameter of 580m and a depth of 23.2m CD.
